Mr. Armstrong, Director of Options Learning, joined the Scholar Leadership Council meeting for a discussion on the Options Learning Program.

Mr. Armstrong discussed and shared with the council what makes the program unique and special, what is new for scholars this year, where the SLC can be used to support the program (ideas to brainstorm, ideation with the SLC in general), and what is on the horizon. He also shared an overview of the OCLC team and mentioned P.L.P. (Personalized Learning Plan) a tool used to guide the connection meetings and help scholars discuss their personal growth. Mr. Armstrong also welcomes the council to share information with other Firebirds to enhance scholar growth. Mr. Armstrong also gave an overview of Seesaw and how to engage in it.

Aure asked if there can be local activities.

Mr. Armstrong mentioned that there are multiple vendors in all areas, he recommends scholars ask their STs about their local activities.

Grace Newell asked if enrichment activities are different than the engagement events. Mr. Armstrong mentioned enrichment activities can come from the Engagement Department and other activities come from the vendor's activities. A. Staff Report

Under Staff Report, Mr. Lewis shared that Veterans Day is Friday, November 11. There will be a scholar virtual assembly Friday, November 18 at 1:00 pm for Indigenous People Month. Fall break will be the third week of December, 21 - Monday through Friday, December 25, 2022.

Mid-year diagnostic assessments will be on the first week of December.

Staff will be able to provide additional support for scholars to finish strong after the Fall break. Mr. Lewis shared that it is important to have these results for the Charter Renewals to support scholars and reflect on where scholars started at the beginning of the year, what they have improved

Compass of San Diego is up for its second renewal coming up at the end of next year where Compass will share the scholar data.

Compass is also currently working on WASC and will have a virtual visit at the end of January/Early February to achieve approval for the next 6-year cycle of CCS, members of WASC will meet in a special meeting with the SLC to go over data.

Compass is currently in its 11th year of operation.

Mr. Lewis mention that the current enrollment cap is set at 2,400 and there is still room for prospective scholars to join the Compass experience.
