With winter approaching, we look forward to the many new things to come for our scholars!


# Online Scholars' Work Samples & Learning Labs

On Halloween, scholars in Ms. Davis' Spanish 1 online class enjoyed a spooky Halloween learning lab and showed off their creative costumes!




In Physical Science, Mr. Spink included AVID strategies and career readiness by teaching scholars about the different career fields in science.


Scholars in Mr. Vazquez's Spanish class did an amazing job on their Spanish heritage projects.

Share one thing about you that very few people know.


I was recruited to play soccer at Pepperdine University

Few people know that I worked as a professional scare-actor for six years. Some of my favorite characters to portray were clowns, dolls, and zombies!


What do you and your family like to do during your free time?
