Coming from a burned-out homeschool mom, I chose Compass because I did not want to teach and grade my child anymore. - encourage academics by engaging with students on their level, with different opportunities that make them feel like they 1. Belong to a school and 2. Want to achieve! By the way, your current 7th grade team is great!
- I appreciate how the parent survey we were asked to complete in January(?) was seemingly designed to truly capture parent feedback ..including in areas Compass may not even think to ask about. In completing this current survey, it feels like it is intended to help Compass report successes and gather mostly black/white responses that do not capture the texture of what's working/not working best. For instance, the question about STs only offered a 1-5 rating scale. But our experience with STs has ranged from fantastic to horrid (i.e. never once planning a monthly check-in call or speaking to my children one time over the course of a year). This is also relevant to our experience with staff; some are exemplary, some are satisfactory at best. I would love if your surveys gave more "Other" response options to inform administration about the diverse family experience ... and ensure Compass is picking up on unseen family experience that we are talking about amongst ourselves. Perhaps create a survey that combines your data gathering needs with more open ended options? Thank you for considering.
- Get your vendor purchase department straightened out. The experience with ordering has been horrific. Hire more staff to keep up with orders.
 Scholars and parents should have access to final invoices. I feel like Compass does a poor job with transparency.
- we are very excited for in person classes.
- As a physician and parent, now with teachers having access to vaccinations,
 I hope we will be resuming normal campus classes.
- I would prefer if I wasn't called by my deadname in almost every single email.

Ideally I would like to order my curriculum and several other resources from Amazon. The limits prohibited me from doing so. I ended up paying out of pocket and having excess funding left over.
