





Programs Offered at NCBs

145 (47%)	Career Focused	Job Training, internships, CTE credentialing	
113 (36%)	Personalized Learning	Individualized content, pace, focus of instruction	
87 (28%)	College Ready	College access or credits, dual enrollment	
72 (23%)	Reengagement / Adult	"At-promise" youth or adults	
53 (17%)	Constructivist	Waldorf, Montessori, project-based	
40 (13%)	Content Focused	VAPA, STEM, etc.	
20 (6%)	21 st Century	21 st Century or Global Education


"Even with the core curriculum, we try to offer supplemental work that's related to what their interests are, to help them refine and verify exactly what their interest is."

Common practice:

"counselors now offer a class which all incoming 9th graders take, where they start thinking about how much do I need to make if I want to live, how expensive are homes and things like that. Really, that's really the nuts and bolts of life, right? What are you going to do after, what is your plan?"

"whether that's 2/4-year, military, gap year, we want to make sure that after your time with Compass, you find the tools and skills you need to be successful in your next chapter."










