We are excited to announce the launch of Learning Ally. This reading program will help all of our scholars who are struggling with reading, not just those with an IEP. This program has over

15,000 titles read in a human voice rather than computer read. This program will help ensure that our scholars have access to participate and enjoy the same grade level readings that their peers are. Supervising teachers and Education Specialists will be able to add scholars who are good candidates for this program. This is a "soft" launch, and we hope to have it available schoolwide by the start of the 2021-2022 school year.
