- ELO funding (1 year) is providing two (2) English Learner (EL) Tutors to help close learning gaps for our English Language Learners
- Scholar Support Coordinator is supporting the AB 104 retention/promotion request process with the management and scheduling of SSTs.


Highlights

Class of 2021 Graduate Data







WOW Fall 2021 Registrations by Family



Highlights


- All Online Scholars have logged in and accessed their courses as of September 14.
 - The initial MA meetings and the Homeroom Synchronous Instruction is contributing to this strong start and high percentage of scholars being on pace.
 - There is a small percentage that show they are behind pace due to program changes, as well as new families; Supervising Teachers are working closely with the families to log in and navigate the system.

Scholars on pace in all Accelerate Education Courses








- AB104 Retention Requests and Grade Change to Pass/No Pass requests
 - No need to retain when a scholar may have the ability to master grade level standards, but their engagement is the cause for low scores and grades.
- AB130 Plan Homeroom (Synchronous) Instruction Update
 - Strong attendance during the first Homeroom, first day of school
 - Scholars completed the STAR benchmark assessment during these sessions, which is the first assignment in the Math and English courses.

AB 104 Retention Requests/Grade Change Requests






Highlights

Coordinator Teams of STs and Scholars




Total Requests, Redacted/WD and SST Scheduled







AB130 Plan Homeroom (Synchronous) Instruction Update







Highlights

- As of September 1, 2021, 269 scholars with IEPs across all three schools.
- 12 Education Specialists, 2 full-time Special Education Coordinators, 1 Special Education Technician, 1 Special Education Director.
- Contracted with new non-public agencies (NPAs)
- Most prevalent eligibility category is Specific Learning Disability, followed by Autism, then Speech-Language Impairment.






- Highest percentage of services across schools: Specialized Academic Instruction (SAI), followed by Speech-Language Therapy
- SAI tracked as live interaction in compliance with AB 130.
- Supplemental curricula available specific to scholars with IEPs include Learning Ally, Read Naturally, Ascend Math, and MaxScholar. These are utilized during SAI.
- SPED team being trained in compliant IEPs due to updates to SEIS




















Special Education: CCS of San Diego











Enrolled scholars who completed diagostic assessments as of 9/17/2021








Compass Charter Schools Diagnostic Results

STAR Early Literacy (grades K-3) Proficiency



STAR Reading (grades K-5) Proficiency



STAR Math (grades 1-5) Proficiency



STAR Reading (grades 6-12) Proficiency


