### **Division Highlights**

- EL scholars are making excellent progress in their ELD Lexia program
- Piloting the dyslexia screener has been going well and is already helping identify necessary supports for scholars
- Holding steady with completion rates for our Accelerated Course Options Program
- High participation in our Engagement activities, but would like to see more interest in our Learning Coach Ambassador program



### **Division Highlights**

- The Online Learning Program has been diligently implementing our MTSS tiered supports to improve scholar progress and achievement.
- Increase in synchronous homeroom instruction attendance in Options Learning Program.
- Compass has 355 scholars with IEPs across all three schools.
- Already planning for Summer Session and for 2022-23 school year



## Academic Support Highlights

- Math Resource Specialist groups started the week of January 3rd.
- Groups based on skill needs are meeting once a week in addition to their small group intervention tutoring sessions.
- We are looking forward to bringing on two (2) additional Resource Specialists (one in ELA and one in reading).
- To date, grade level growth in Freckle is higher for scholars attending tutoring versus those that are not.



## Academic Support Highlights

- Our EL scholars are finishing their semester strong with an 87% passing rate in their ELD course!
- Our Scholar Support Coordinator has conducted 14 dyslexia screeners to date (compared to 11 total from 21/22 school year) using the Curriculum-Based Measurement (CBM) assessment in Renaissance to determine potential risks of dyslexia.
  - This screener allows for additional early interventions and is in preparation for SB 237 implementation for Fall of 2022.

- WIG Update:
  - 82% of teachers reported that the tool used to implement MTSS tier 1 strategies in their live sessions positively impacted their instruction and scholar learning.
  - 78% of the scholars who were identified as "at promise" (at-risk, determined by course pacing and grade average) attended a connection meeting and received notices twice a month, in efforts to support improvement.



- Online Learning Department Professional Learning Communities (PLC) meetings:
  - Online teachers continued to utilize the resources and tools provided by the Staff Support Department and Instructional Coaches to choose a tool to use during their live instruction.
  - The Online teachers utilized these tools that included Listenwise, AVID WICOR reading strategies, and Nearpod to implement the MTSS Tier 1 interventions.



- Online PLC meetings continued:
  - This tool was then implemented to leverage MTSS tier 1 interventions to target scholar learning during synchronous instruction, learning labs, and small group instruction.
- Scholar Collaboration Meetings
  - Scholars identified as "at promise" (at-risk) were flagged by the Online Learning Department and the Counseling Services Department as needing urgent support and were the focus of scholar collaboration meetings that took place the week of January 10, 2022.



- Scholar Collaboration Meetings continued:
  - During these meetings, the team of teachers, counselors, and members of the Academic Support
     Department collaborated to create a plan that outlined next steps for each scholar to implement additional supports.
- Synchronous Instruction and Learning labs:
  - The Online Learning Department continues to see the highest attendance percentage for Synchronous Instruction in grades K-3.



- Synchronous Instruction and Learning Labs continued:
  - In grades K-3, scholars attend synchronous sessions
    Monday through Friday with their supervising teacher.
  - In grades 4-12, scholars have the opportunity to attend their synchronous homeroom instruction once a week
  - Online scholars in grades 4-12 have a higher attendance rate in their content specific learning labs than in their synchronous homeroom instruction.



- Online Connection Meetings:
  - Along with targeting support for scholars identified as "at promise" (at risk), Online Supervising Teachers (STs) have continued to hold connection meetings with scholars each month.
  - Many families have shared that these meetings and the use of the Online PLP have added value to the Online Learning Program this school year.

- K-3 scholars attend synchronous instructional sessions 5 days a week.
- Grades 4-12 attend synchronous instructional sessions 1 day a week
- Grades 4-12 also have content<sup>5%</sup> specific learning labs during <sup>0%</sup> the week.





#### Online Learning Connection Meetings for LP 3



- The Options Program continues to utilize their Personalized Learning Plans (PLPs) at monthly Connection Meetings.
  - Supervising Teachers continue to discuss scholars' progress towards mastery of the grade level standards and review the body of work, which are the completed grade level work products for each assigned course, each learning period.



- This upcoming learning period, Supervising Teachers will use this connection to discuss grades and encourage scholars to showcase their learning through a project or completed work products to demonstrate their growth
- Continuing to see the growth in attendance to the Options Homeroom (Synchronous) Instruction.
  - TK-3 has increased by 3%, 4th-5th graders by 11%, 6th-8th by 9%, and 9th-12th by 1%.
- Options STs have been collaborating in PLCs to integrate strategies and instructional tools in their live synch lessons to support on-watch scholars' progress in their ELA and Math achievement.



- The Options STs have been encouraging their scholars who have been identified as "on watch" by their beginning of the year STAR assessment to work in Freckle Math and Reading for additional support and intervention.
- Options WIG Update:
  - 11% of scholars "on watch" in early literacy met their Freckle goal
  - $\circ~67\%$  of scholars "on watch" in ELA met the Freckle goal
  - Scholars "on watch" in Math surpassed the Freckle goal by almost doubling it, at 195%



- The Options STs has experienced shifts in staffing.
- In the coming weeks, Options admin will be onboarding two new STs
- Slight decrease in Options families' attendance at connection meetings
  - CCS of Los Angeles has dipped by 2%, CCS of San Diego by 2%, and CCS of Yolo by 7%. With our overall down by 3%.
  - LP3 connection attendance decreased over the fall break, as schedules were adjusted; there were a number of families who were impacted by COVID after traveling over break, which also impacted their ability to attend connection meetings.

#### Special Education Highlights

- As of January 13, 2022, Compass has 355 scholars with IEPs across all three schools.
- 10 Education Specialists, 2 full-time Special Education Coordinators, 1 Special Education Technician, and one Special Education Tutor; adding new Education Specialists soon
- Contracted with new non-public agencies (NPAs)
  - Most prevalent eligibility category is Specific Learning Disability, followed by Autism, then Speech-Language Impairment.





### Special Education Highlights

- Highest percentage of services across schools: Specialized Academic Instruction (SAI), followed by Speech-Language Therapy
- SAI tracked as live interaction in compliance with AB 130.
- Supplemental curricula available specific to scholars with IEPs include Learning Ally, Read Naturally, Ascend Math, and MaxScholar. They are all research-based subscriptions that provide targeted intervention for scholars who struggle in Reading and Math. These are also utilized during SAI.

## Staff Support Highlights

- Second "Pick Your Pathway" professional learning session was launched
  - These research-based strategies are proven to positively impact scholar achievement
- Seeing consistent usage in Freckle
  - Online
    - 2,176 total minutes in December
    - 10,804 total minutes in November (decrease in minutes is a result of holiday breaks)
  - $\circ$  Options
    - 42,378 total minutes in December
    - 201,826 total minutes in November (decrease in minutes is a result of holiday break)



### Staff Support Highlights

- Daily Dose Math and ELA
  - Average of 52% growth from the 3 pre and post quizzes for math
  - Average of 59% growth from the 2 pre and post quizzes for ELA
