Academic Support Highlights

- All three (3) Resource Specialists are completely onboarded and are providing additional weekly intervention sessions targeted by further skill-needs. Make-up sessions and office hours are also being provided. This support is in addition to our MTSS intervention tutoring.
- The number of weekly EL live session tutoring has tripled from what was provided to our ELL scholars in 20/21.
- EL and MTSS tutoring/resource groups are being tracked as live interaction in compliance with AB 130/167.



Academic Support Highlights

- A higher rate of TK-5 EL scholars are approaching proficiency (41%) in 21/22 compared to 20/21 (35%).
- The rate of 6-12th grade EL scholars that passed their Semester 1 ELA course increased from 78% in 20/21 to 88% in 21/22.
- Scholars that attend their live tutoring sessions outperform scholars that do not attend their sessions in their ELA courses:
 - 55% of TK-5 EL scholars that attended at least 25% of their live EL tutoring sessions are proficient or higher versus 41% that did not attend.
 - 79% of 6-12th grade EL scholars that attended at least 25% of their live EL tutoring sessions received a C or higher in their ELA course versus 63% that did not attend.

Academic Support Highlights


- TK-5 EL scholars showed considerable improvement (average of 6% increase) towards Grade Level Material from BOY to MOY in 20/21 <u>and</u> 21/22
- 6-12th grade EL scholars show an improvement in all 3 Lexia areas from BOY to MOY in 20/21 <u>and 21/22</u>
- Scholars identified as needing intervention supports through our MTSS framework, improved in Reading, Math, and Early Literacy on the BOY to MOY STAR Benchmarks for all 3 CCS schools.
- Overall STAR benchmark scores from BOY to MOY improved for our 504 scholars by 25% for Early Literacy, 7% in Reading, and 14% in Math.







English Language Support- CCS: 6-12 English Learner ELA Grades vs. Attendance to live EL Tutoring Sessions









Scholar Support Current Total of 504 Plans by Charter


504 Plan: Count by CCS School






Scholar Support Current Total of 504 Referrals by Charter







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Counseling Services Highlights

- CCS High School Credit Status Progress Data
 - February 2022 high school credit status progress data for scholars in grades 9th - 12th in meeting graduation requirements within the four year cohort at the close of the fall term.
 - 67% of high school scholars are on track to graduate within the 4-year cohort
 - 24% of high school scholars are at risk of not graduating within the 4-year cohort
 - 9% of high school scholars show severe credit deficiencies in meeting graduation requirements within the 4-year cohort





Counseling Services Highlights

- Counseling confirmed 28 scholars for Fall 2021 who earned their high school diploma and 68% were within the 4-year cohort with 43% being awarded a state seal.
- Scholar Participation in the Accelerated Course Options Program (ACOP) during Fall 2021 was 20%. The intervention program supports eligible scholars to recover lost credits or advance in meeting high school graduation requirements. The course passing rate was 83%




Counseling Services Highlights

- Through the use of ESSER Mental Health Supports, our new counselor position has supported small groups in grades 4th-8th and supported the facilitation of short term individual counseling sessions with scholars identified as high risk.
- In the process of expanding these supports with an action plan to address additional mental health supports for the 2022/23 school year.


CCS High School Credit Status Progress Data Fall 2021














Engagement Field Trip Registration and Attendance



Current Total Registrations for Field Trips for 2021-22 SY


Current Total Attendance for Field Trips for 2021-22 SY








Engagement Scholar Clubs Registration and Attendance



Current Total Registrations for Scholar Clubs for 2021-22 SY


Current Total Attendance for Scholar Clubs for 2021-22 SY








Engagement Virtual Scholar Workshop Registration and Attendance



- Online Learning Department WIG Update:
 - 88% (+11%) of teachers reported that the tool used to implement MTSS tier 1 strategies in their live sessions positively impacted their instruction and scholar learning.
 - 83% (+7%) of the scholars who were identified as "at risk concern" attended a connection meeting, received notices, and action plans were created during scholar collaboration meeting in efforts to support improvement.



- Semester 1 passing D/2 or higher
 - The Online Learning Department has seen an overall increase in passing rates in all grade levels and charters
 - This increase, especially with the Online High School scholars, in passing rates helps further meet the organizational WIG by those high school scholars earning credits towards graduation.
 - The Online high school passing rates were the highest than previous years (+5) with 75% of scholars passing courses and earning credits towards graduation.



- Semester 1 passing C or higher
 - These percentages represent scholar who are close to or at proficient in regard to meeting grade level standards.
 - There has been an increase (+3%) in the percentage of Online K-8 scholars earning a C or higher for semester 1 final grades than semester 1 final grades during the 2020-21 school year.
 - The increases appear to be linked to more opportunities to interact with the ST, such as synch homeroom sessions and connection meetings.



- Synchronous instruction and learning labs
 - The Online Learning Department has seen consistent attendance in the synchronous sessions.
 - Note that grades 4-12, scholars attend synchronous sessions in addition to their core content learning labs.
 - There is no incentive to attend these homeroom sessions, nor it is attached to a course grade like the content learning labs



- Synchronous instruction and learning labs continued:
 - The Online Learning Department is also continuing to see great attendance in core content learning labs
 - In grades 4-12, 68% of scholars, on average, attended learning labs during semester 1.
 - In grades 4-5, 73% of scholars, on average, attended learning labs during semester 1.
 - In grades 6-8, 76% of scholars, on average, attended learning labs during semester 1.
 - In grades 9-12, 60% of scholars, on average, attended learning labs during semester 1.



- Online connection meetings
 - These meetings were piloted last year and fully implemented this year.
 - The Online connection meetings have helped Supervising Teachers target scholar needs and review academic progress regularly with families.
 - Support LCAPs by providing opportunity for scholars to showcase their learning
 - Builds relational capacity with LCs and scholars



- Online Tiered Re-engagement
 - The Online Learning Department is continuing to see success with the Tiered Re-engagement process.
 - Tier 1 outreach and follow-up is addressing most barriers and resolving re-engagement concerns
 - Overall, only ¹/₃ of scholars identified for tier 1 are moved to tier 2; only 3% of Online scholars progressed to tier 3.












2021-22 Semester 1 Online Passing Rates D/2 or higher









- Options Learning Department WIG update
 - The Options Learning Department saw gains made on the WIG scoreboard, especially regarding scholars identified as "on watch", per the STAR benchmark assessment, moving into the "green" for time spent addressing learning gaps by engaging in Freckle
 - Options connecting meetings held by learning period that were also in the "green" indicator.
 - The Options Advisory, Learning PLCs, and Coordinators continue to collaborate regarding addressing indicators that are in the "blue"



- Connection meetings
 - High rates (over 75%); opportunities for scholars to showcase learning
- Semester 1 final grades
 - Outstanding passing rates (97%) for semester 1 final grades.
 - As scholars show proficiency with grade level standards, the Options program contributes to meeting the overall WIG goal to prepare scholars for graduation and success in the next grade level.



- Synchronous instruction
 - Continue to see participation in attendance in synchronous sessions during our first year with AB130/167 requirements.
 - The Supervising Teachers and Options scholars have anecdotally shared the positive impact that these sessions have on building relational capacity.
 - We are seeing increases in scholar achievement correlated to the additional scholar/family interaction opportunities with STs.



- Tiered Re-engagement
 - The Options Learning Department continues to show success with the Tiered Re-engagement process.
 - The Tiered Re-engagement process also supports Supervising Teachers in assessing scholar academic progress.
 - The tier 1 notices have been effective in addressing the academic barriers and establishing the expectations to ensure scholars are engaged in their learning.
 - Only 2% of scholars were identified as needing tier 2 intervention; the number progressing to tier 3 was 1%.










2021-22 Semester 1 Options passing rates D/2 or higher






2021-22 Semester 1 Options Passing Rates C or higher





2021-22 Semester 1 Options Homeroom Synchronous Instruction Attendance





Special Education Highlights

- Highest percentage of services across schools continue to be: Specialized Academic Instruction (SAI), followed by Speech-Language Therapy
- SAI tracked as live interaction, in compliance with AB 130.
- Supplemental curricula targeting math and reading that are available, and used during SAI, specific to scholars with IEPs include Learning Ally, Read Naturally, Ascend Math, and MaxScholar. They are all research-based and data-backed subscriptions.





Special Education Highlights

- As of March 3, 2022, Compass has 392 scholars with IEPs across all three schools.
- 14 Education Specialists, 2 full-time Special Education Coordinators, 1 Special Education Technician, and 2 Instructional Aides
- Contracted with new non-public agencies (NPAs)
- Most prevalent eligibility category is Specific Learning Disability, followed by Autism, then Speech-Language Impairment.





Special Education Highlights

- The average caseload for our Education Specialists is 25 scholars.
- CCS of Los Angeles has 151 scholars CCS of Yolo has 118 scholars, and CCS of San Diego has 105 scholars.
- There are 284 scholars with IEPs in the Options Program, and 114 scholars with IEPs in the Online Program.
- There are many NPAs Compass contracts with to provide related services to our scholars. Currently, Oxford and Presence Learning have the highest percentage of our scholars.






- In CCS of Los Angeles, the percent of scholars with IEPs scoring at or above grade levels on benchmark increased by 8% in Reading, 6% in Math, and 9% in Early Literacy from Fall to Winter.
- In CCS of San Diego, the percent of scholars with IEPs scoring at or above grade level decreased by 1.9% in Reading, by 3.8% in Math, and by 4.9% in Early Literacy from Fall to Winter. We will research the causes.
- In CCS of Yolo, the percent of scholars with IEPs scoring at or above grade level increased by 0.9% in Reading, 10.5% in Math, and remained the same in Early Literacy from Fall to Winter.




Scholars with IEPs Count by Campus





Staff Support Highlights

- STAR Data
 - The majority of grade level populations showed growth in reading and math in all three CCS schools
 - Some grade levels were flat, so the academic teams are assessing the barriers, and putting systems in place, such as middle school Freckle learning labs, to ensure scholars are making progress in meeting their academic goals, and grade-level standards
 - The Staff Support team analyzed the mid-year data, and discussed that it is common to see a dip in performance from elementary to middle school, and then performance climbs again in high school.
