Jpdate	The MTSS and Resource tutoring started on October 3, 2022 with 1,257 scholars rostered into the Fall MTSS tutoring sessions for English Language Arts or math, some combined. Our Scholar Success team is currently providing intervention to approximately 250+ scholars that attend each week. They are using Freckle and Lalilo as intervention tools and the data is used to shape the direction of the next lesson. In order to increase engagement, scholars have set personal academic goals that will be revisited throughout the semester. Scholars who do not score a 70% on session assessment, are encouraged to repeat the lesson until they've mastered the skill. Additionally, Tutors, Resource Specialists and the Scholar Success Coordinator are checking in with scholars who miss two sessions in a row (either by email or phone call). In order to provide support to scholars who cannot attend, team members are uploading recordings into Nearpod lessons and tracking asynchronous participation.
	The Teacher on Special Assignment (ToSA) team has been meeting to discuss team updates and the next steps with Curriculum Based Measures (CBM). CBM's are short assessments within Renaissance that can be given to scholars in grades K-6 to determine specific strengths or weaknesses within a content area. CBM will give us data regarding supporting scholars, under our MTSS Framework. In other words, CBM will give teams actionable data to assist with intervention, and is a proactive practice in applying interventions early. CBM re-screening will take place in December for those scholars who were screened in September and are attending intervention.

Update	Our Counseling Services Department is utilizing the Columbia-Suicide Serverity Rating Scale (C-SSRS) to support suicide risk screenings. This screening is evidence based and universally used for all ages. The screening assess the severity and immediacy of suicidal risk, and gauges the level of support that a person needs.
	The Panorama baseline survey was launched on Tuesday, October 4.16% (284 out of 1,737) of scholars in grades 3-12 completed the survey. The Panorama team conducted a training on November 30th, on how to interpret the data.
	The Scholar Success Coordinator provides SEL warm-up activities via a newsletter each month. Supervising teachers (STs) can use these during learning labs as well as to share activities with learning coaches (parents or legal guardians) and scholars during their connection meetings that can be incorporated into daily instruction. STs also include SEL warm-up activities during their daily and weekly synchronous instruction time.
On Our Docket	STs will use the data collected from the Panorama survey to drive SEL strategies and specific MTSS supports for scholars. School Counselors will continue to work in collaboration with all academic departments to provide interventions that help remove barriers to positive social emotional development.

This PLN provided an opportunity to collaborate, share knowledge, and learn from leading experts in the field. The keynote by Dr. Maryanne Wolf discussed cognitive neuroscience research into the development of the "reading brain" and how this knowledge can impact assessment and intervention.
	Our Human Resources team attended the 84th American Association of School Personnel (AASPA) Conference in Orlando, FL from October 10-13 where they accepted the 2022 AASPA Newsletter Award for The Compass Way Newsletter.
	Compass hosted our first All Staff In-Service Day of the school year on October 14. All instructional staff had the opportunity to attend sessions like "Equity at Compass" where they reviewed which Social Emotional Learning (SEL) strategies are currently being used to promote equity and learn about equity trends in education. Other sessions included the ABC's of Empowering McKinney-Vento Program, Homeschool Methodologies, and Responsive and Meaningful Best Practices to Support English Learners: The EL Roadmap.
	Our Scholar Community Advocate attended the Completing the FAFSA/CADAA: A How-To for Adult Supporters of Youth Experiencing Homelessness workshop On October 19. This workshop focused on how to assist those working with homeless youth to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or California Dream Act

	Application (CADAA). The webinar reviewed the FAFSA and CADAA, page by page, including detailed instructions on how eligible students experiencing homelessness can qualify as independent students for the purposes of maximizing financial aid. This workshop was hosted by the California Student Aid Commission. A delegation from Compass attended the APlus+ conference and brought back strategies to share with staff regarding English Learners, MTSS, and equitable access to curriculum.

Update	As part of the support/resources provided by the EL Coordinator in support of the CDE's English Learner Roadmap, Compass values the languages and cultures that our EL scholars bring to their education and are assets for their own learning and are important contributors to all learning communities. These assets are valued and support building capacity of our teachers in providing culturally responsive curriculum and instruction and in programs that support, where possible, the development of proficiency in multiple languages. The Academic Support team has had 820 scholars attend at least 1 live session since the beginning of the school year (including intervention tutoring, resource groups, bootcamps, and EL sessions). The EL Department has begun using the Here at Every session Ready and On time (HERO) program for EL synchronous group sessions. EL tutors are holding weekly raffles as an award incentive for scholars who attend. There was a 2% increase in scholar attendance from September to October since the HERO program was implemented. We have seen an increase in Lexia passing rates. The passing rate for the month of September was 70% while the passing rate increased to 78% in October. The English Learner Support team will be using STAR Spanish to assess scholars who have the same/low ELPI for two consecutive years, a reduction in ELPI level, and/or newcomers to CA/US schooling. By using STAR Spanish, the supervising teacher (ST) will be able to test their own scholars or opt-in to get support from the English Learner Support team to help with language support. So far approximately 33 scholars have been rostered to take STAR Spanish.

Update	All supervising teachers (STs) are offering engaging live synchronous sessions, as well as asynchronous sessions. Synchronous Learning lessons for all scholars started on August 31. The Online Learning Department has been looking at Online data reporting for this fall. The data reporting will focus on scholar performance, data

collection from the School Pathways Student Information System (SPSIS), and selfreported information provided by the Online STs. This data will continue to evaluate how tier 1 interventions and strategies are leveraged within Accelerate Education courses, live instructional sessions, and connection meetings by empowering scholars to choose assignments and assessments to showcase that represent their learning styles and support needs. The Options Learning Department has daily scheduled live synchronous sessions for scholars grade TK-3, and weekly live synchronous instruction offerings weekly for scholars grades 4-12. Students that are interested in completing A-G courses have access to curated A-G accredited courses supported by subject specific credentialed STs. STs also hold support sessions during monthly connection meetings to ensure scholars are supported and monitored. High School scholars participate in monitored testing sessions as well. Scholars and learning coaches that are not meeting live synchronous instruction expectation participate in independent study evaluation meetings where a scholar support team gathers to develop an action plan focused on increasing synchronous instruction engagement and participation. Asynchronously, our scholars engage with STs via Seesaw, a digital work portfolio, where teachers review work, provide feedback where teachers can review work, provide feedback and assign additional work if needed to ensure scholars are meeting grade level standards. Since the start of EL tutor synchronous sessions on August 31, 2022 there has been an increase of 2% (33% for the month of October) set by the baseline of average attendance of 31% for the month of September. Tutors have been focussed on engagement and also hold 1:1 sessions for at risk scholars who require additional support in Lexia/ELD Course.
