How do I get access to Twinkl?

Twinkl is available to CCS families as a year-long membership, and you will only need one per family. The cost will be adjusted based on how many families purchase a membership. If there are at least 5 interested CCS families, the cost will be around \$117 for the yearly membership, but the cost will be lowered with each additional membership. If you are interested in purchasing a membership for the 2018-19 school year, please contact your EF by November 30th for the link to an interest form.
