Per CDE, The legislation allocates 1 percent of the kindergarten through grade twelve (K–12) portion of the Proposition 98 funding guarantee provided in the prior fiscal year, excluding funding appropriated for the AMS education program. Local educational agencies (LEAs) with 500 or more students are required to ensure that at least 80 percent of AMS funds to be expended are used to employ certificated or classified employees to provide arts education program instruction. The remaining funds must be used for training, supplies and materials, and arts educational partnership programs, with no more than 1 percent of funds received to be used for an LEA's administrative expenses.

1. Narrative description of the Proposition 28 arts education programs funded (2500 character limit).

PREPA TEC-Los Angeles offers a comprehensive music and arts education to all students. From 6th through 8th grade, students participate in one or two year-long performing arts courses, receiving an average of 243 minutes of instruction each week. In addition to performing arts, students have the opportunity to take theater and graphic arts. In graphic arts, students learn to communicate effectively through visual media by creating projects such as posters, logos, and advertisements that combine images, words, and design principles.

Curriculum Frameworks and Instructional Resources Division

The Arts, Music, & Instructional Materials Block Grant (AMIM) was established by Section 134 of Chapter 52 of the Statutes of 2022 and amended by Section 102 of Chapter 48 of the Statutes of 2023. As of June 2024, Section 100 of Chapter 38 of the Statutes of 2024 (Senate Bill No. 153) further amended the legislation to add a final expenditure report requirement in the following provision:

(c)(1) Funding appropriated pursuant to this section shall be available for expenditure through June 30, 2026. Local educational agencies are encouraged, but not required, to proportionally use resources received pursuant to this section for the purposes noted in paragraphs (1) to (5), inclusive, of subdivision (a) and to support arts and music education programs. By September 30, 2026, each local educational agency receiving an allocation pursuant to this section shall report final expenditures to the State Department of Education, which shall initiate collection of any unexpended funds. Any local educational agency that does not submit the final expenditure report shall forfeit all funds allocated pursuant to this section.

(2) Notwithstanding paragraph (1), if a charter school ceases to operate before June 30, 2026, its final expenditure report shall be due to the department within 60 days of the effective date of closure and the department shall collect any unexpended funds.
