Funding Sources

The supplemental appropriations are funded by additional FY2026 revenue, including MLO revenue and the PPR adjustment, fund transfers, and the previously approved January 2026 use of beginning fund balance in Fund 41 for District Bond Proceeds.

The FY2026-27 budget includes the use of beginning fund balance in Fund 28 Stargate Foundation/Building Corp for completion of the previously approved construction project. The original bond-funded construction project totaled \$21,025,000; however, a portion of those funds was spent during FY2025-26. The remaining unspent construction funds at June 30, 2026 are carried forward into FY2026-27 as beginning fund balance and appropriated for completion of the approved construction project. These funds are restricted to construction and building-related costs and do not represent new operating revenue or new long-term debt of Stargate Charter School.

Strategic Allocation Plan for Projected FY26 General Fund Surplus

Following the positive financial trends noted in the **FY26 Q3 Financial Statements**, our year-end surplus has trended at a level higher than originally projected.

In May 2026, the administration successfully executed the approved one-time Staff Bonus out of Fund 11 (General Fund). Even after this disbursement, Stargate is projected to conclude the fiscal year with a net surplus of approximately \$2.5 million.

To maximize the long-term impact of these funds while maintaining fiscal oversight, the Administration requests Board approval to transfer \$2.2 million from Fund 11 into Fund 43, Capital Reserve and Capital Projects. These funds will be reserved for planned technology, library, safety and security, curriculum, and long-term facility and capital needs. The remaining General Fund surplus will remain in Fund 11 as an operational cushion.

Surplus Allocation Timeline: FY26 – FY28+

Timing Clarification: The June 2026 Board action approves the transfer of projected FY26 surplus funds from Fund 11 to Fund 43 before fiscal year-end. The FY27 and FY28 amounts shown are included for planning and transparency purposes. Future expenditures from Fund 43 will follow the normal budget and Board approval process, and any use of the remaining long-term reserve will require future Board approval.

Detailed Timeline & Milestone Breakdown

Milestone 1: May 2026 — Human Capital Investment (Completed)

- **Action:** Disbursed \$500,000 from Fund 11 for the one-time staff bonus.
- **Strategic Rationale:** One time “Thank You” to our staff in appreciation for all that they do for our students, families, and school community, without adjusting recurring salary schedules.
- **Milestone 2: June 2026 — Capital Reserve Transfer**
- **Action:** Request a board resolution to transfer \$2.2 million from Fund 11 to Fund 43.
- **Strategic Rationale:** Transferring these funds to the Capital Reserve and Capital Projects Fund allows Stargate to preserve one-time surplus funds for planned capital, technology, safety, security, curriculum, and long-term facility needs. This approach supports long-term financial planning while maintaining appropriate General Fund reserves for ongoing operations.
- **Milestone 3: Fiscal Year 2026-27 — Technology Lifecycle Infrastructure**
- **Action:** Allocate \$400,000 from Fund 43 for a comprehensive Chromebook and hardware refresh.
- **Strategic Rationale:** Upgrading our 1:1 student device program ensures zero disruptions to technology-integrated learning and lowers ongoing IT maintenance overhead.

Milestone 4: FY2026-27 — Safety and Security Enhancements

- **Action:** Allocate \$270,000 from Fund 43 for additional safety and security improvements to supplement awarded grant funding.
- **Strategic Rationale:** The Board previously approved supplemental support for safety and security improvements. The awarded grant amount was lower than originally anticipated, so additional local funding is needed to complete the planned safety and security work.

Milestone 5: Fiscal Year 2027-28 — Core Instructional Curriculum Adoption

- **Action:** Draw down \$300,000 from Fund 43 to fund the primary English curriculum adoption.
- **Strategic Rationale:** Major textbook and digital license adoptions create significant financial strain when funded in a single year. Pre-saving this money ensures our teachers get top-tier materials in FY28 without compromising that year's regular operational needs.

Milestone 6: Post-FY28 — Strategic Plan for Remainder Funds

- **Action:** Retain the remaining **\$1,150,000** as assigned, non-committed capital within Fund 43.
- **Strategic Rationale:** These funds will safely sit in the Capital Reserve Fund, accruing interest and strengthening our overall balance sheet. The administrative team will engage in a long-term planning process to evaluate campus infrastructure, facility extensions, or safety enhancements.

Board Safeguard: No portion of this remaining \$1.15 million can or will be spent without a formal vote on, and approval by, the Board of Directors at a future date.

INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE STUDENTS

1.0 General. Stargate School is committed to allowing the admission of a limited number of international exchange students to the education program offered by Stargate High School. However, to protect the interests of the school and students, the only international exchange students who shall be admitted are students from Adams 12 Five Star School District-approved international exchange programs.

1.1 International exchange organizations are [approved by the District](#). District approval must be obtained prior to seeking the admission of any international exchange student to Stargate School.

1.2 International exchange students associated with District-approved exchange programs shall be considered wards of the families with whom they reside.

1.3 This policy shall apply to non-immigrant students from other countries who are temporarily residing with a Stargate School family without their parents/legal guardians for the purpose of attending school. These students are those that would qualify for a J-1 visa. This policy shall not apply to resident aliens, political exiles or students from other countries residing in Adams 12 Five Star Schools with their parents/legal guardians. Students in the United States on a visitor visa are not entitled to enroll in Stargate School.

2.0 Sponsoring Organizations. All sponsoring exchange organizations must adhere to the District application procedure and complete the required forms, which may be obtained from the Schools of Choice/Enrollment Office of Adams 12 Five Star Schools. All programs are subject to district review and approval.

2.1 All sponsoring exchange organizations meet the following minimum requirements in order to be considered for approval by Adams 12 Five Star Schools:

2.1.1 The program must be approved by and in good standing with the Council for Standards for International Educational Travel (CSIET). Adams County civic organizations may be exempt from being approved by CSIET but must comply with all other requirements for international exchange organizations.

2.1.2 The program must have a local representative who resides within the greater metropolitan Denver area and who will meet with school personnel, the student and the host family on a regular basis.

2.1.3 The exchange organization must provide outbound exchange opportunities for American students just as it provides inbound exchange opportunities for students from other countries. The local representative must supply each high school with literature about its outbound programs and offer to talk with interested students about those programs.

2.1.4 Orientation, both pre-departure and upon arrival in the United States, must be provided to help international exchange students adjust to a new culture and, perhaps, language. Ongoing contact and

support from the local representative of the exchange organization must also be provided.

2.1.5 Orientation must be provided to the host family in advance of the international exchange student's arrival. The family should be acquainted with the needs and requirements of housing a visitor for a long period of time, advised of potential problems in hosting an exchange student, and provided with suggestions for coping with these problems. Ongoing contact and support from the local representative of the exchange organization must also be provided.

2.2 Timelines. An international exchange student agency may request permission to submit student applications directly to District high schools using the following procedures:

2.2.1 An Adams 12 International Exchange Organization Application (Form A) must be completed and filed with the superintendent's designee between September 1 and October 15 of the school year prior to placement of exchange students.

2.2.2 Once a sponsoring agency is approved to submit student applications to schools the agency will remain on the list of approved agencies unless there is cause to remove the agency for not following the expectations outlined in this policy.

3.0 The following procedures are established for the regulation of international exchange students:

3.1 Stargate School shall establish yearly numbers, to be determined by availability after the admissions lottery pull, not to exceed four. Guidelines for international exchange students, deadlines for placement, for receipt of files and special course requirements as they deem necessary. International exchange students must also meet the admissions criteria of Stargate School.

4.0 Exchange Students. All international exchange students must meet the following minimum requirements in order to be considered for approval by Adams 12 Five Star Schools and Stargate School:

4.1 International exchange students must obtain a student visa. Stargate School does not issue I-20 forms.

4.2 Students must be at least 16 years of age but not more than 19 before October 1 of the year of enrollment in Stargate School.

4.3 The student must be a secondary school student in his/her home country who has completed at least 2 years of high school or equivalent but who has not completed more than 11 years of primary and secondary study and must have not graduated from high school or its equivalent.

4.4 The student must not have previously participated in an academic year or semester student exchange program in the United States or attended school in the United States in either F-1 or J-1 visa status.

4.5 The student must reside with a legal adult who has a current student enrolled in Stargate School.

4.6 International exchange students who are not sufficiently proficient in the English language to participate in the high school curriculum shall be considered for inclusion into Stargate's English Language Development (ELD) program on the same basis as any other student enrolled at Stargate.

4.7 To request admission, the international exchange organization must submit the following

documents to the requested school:

4.7.1 A completed International Exchange Student Application (Adams 12 School District Policy 5280, Form B);

4.7.2 A copy of the face page of the host family agency application;

4.7.3 A body of evidence supporting the students academic level. To include, but not limited to: Three years of official transcripts and/or records of prior education from the student's home school, an English translation of these documents and an interpretation of the grading system from the student's home school in English. Evidence that the student has successfully completed a minimum of three years of instruction in English, which includes speaking and listening as well as reading and writing;

4.7.4 A cognitive assessment report, including scores and percentiles that show advanced ability , translated into English.

4.7.5 Evidence of required immunizations, a physical examination and appropriate insurance must be provided before a student will be approved;

4.7.6 Proof of English language proficiency: evidence the student has passed a test of the English language proficiency, such as the SLEP, TOEFL, CEFR, or FSI, at a level of proficient or higher. For the SLEP test, that is a rating of 48 or higher. For the CEFR, students may score from B2 to C2, and for TOEFL, students should score above 80th percentile.

4.8 Timelines. An agency and/or parent may request attendance at Stargate School using the following procedures:

4.8.1 An Adams 12 International Exchange Student Application (Form B) must be completed and filed with the Admissions and Enrollment Manager between March 1st and the last business day on or before July 31st. Agencies/parents will be notified of the school's decision to accept or deny the application no later than the week of spring break the school year prior to attendance.

4.8.2 A written application or a letter of application from the potential international exchange student to the school. This application/letter should provide pertinent information about the student (e.g. name, age, birth date, home country, level of education), the student's reasons for wanting to attend Stargate School. The name, address and phone number(s) of the international exchange student's own parents/guardians, the host family and the local international exchange program representative; and

4.8.3 Two character references translated into English, one must be from the student's English language teacher documenting the type of instruction the student has had and the student's level of proficiency and one from someone who has been acquainted with the student for at least one year. This may include completing a normed observation scale and an interview with the student, or gifted characteristics intake form.

4.8.4 The application and body of evidence will be reviewed by the Student Admissions Review Team.

5.0 Status & Academic Standards for International Exchange Students.

5.1 International exchange students will be treated as regular students. They are responsible for complying with district and Stargate School policies regarding attendance, academic standards, responsibilities and rights and discipline.

5.2 International exchange students are expected to take five classes per term including one language arts/English class and one American/U.S. History and/or government class and are expected to maintain passing grades in all classes.

5.3 International exchange students shall be enrolled for up to one full school year and will be classified as juniors or seniors at the discretion of each school. In general, Stargate does not accept semester-only placements. International exchange students will earn grades and receive credit for courses successfully completed but will not be included on the cumulative academic class ranking.

5.4 International exchange students are not eligible to receive a Stargate School diploma but will be allowed to walk at graduation and formally recognized with an honorary certificate of attendance.

5.5 Exchange students are not eligible to receive scholastic awards but may be eligible to receive extracurricular awards.

5.6 The eligibility requirements of the Colorado High Schools Activities Association (CHSAA) will be followed. Interested parties should refer to the CHSAA bylaws, article 18, section 1870-international students.

5.7 International exchange students are expected to pay for all lunches, book, athletic, student activity and other fees, yearbook costs and all other school-incurred expenses that are expected of other students at Stargate School. Stargate School or group activity funds will not be allowed for these expenses and there will be no fee waivers or reduced prices.

6.0 Suspension, Revocation, Dismissal.

6.1 Exchange organizations, private sponsors, host families and/or international exchange students found to be in violation of any of the Adams 12 Five Star School policies are subject to having their relationship with the district terminated.

Stargate Admissions Policy

Overview

Stargate School is a K-12 charter school serving gifted students as defined in C.R.S 22-20-202(11). The school reviews a Body of Evidence (hereafter referred to as BOE) submitted with each application to determine if Stargate is an appropriate educational placement. Stargate is committed to assisting in the collection of this BOE while ensuring that families are not subjected to unnecessary hardship. Prospective students are placed into a random computerized lottery, contingent on available seats per grade. Priority may be extended to certain students, such as siblings of currently enrolled students.

Applications must be submitted by 11:59 p.m. MST on the specified due date in order to be considered for the current application year.

Admissions deadlines, detailed application information, and the link to the electronic application system are posted on the Stargate School website at www.stargateschool.org for each application year. For additional questions, please email admissions@stargateschool.org.

Partnership with Adams 12 Five Star School District

Minimum Age: Stargate School adheres to [Adams 12 Policy 5230](#) for kindergarten and first grade minimum age requirements.

Equal Opportunity:

1. Application Process

2. Body Of Evidence

Stargate School reviews a BOE that is submitted with the application to determine whether the school is an appropriate educational placement. This process is in line with the Colorado Exceptional Children's Educational Act (ECEA), and supported by CRS 22-30.5-104(8).

Students identified as gifted by a Colorado school district, who meet the requirements for identification set forth in the Exceptional Children's Education Act (ECEA) 12.02(2)(c) and who have an Advanced Learning Plan (ALP) may submit their ALP as the BOE. Stargate may request supporting documentation with regards to a student's ALP.

A BOE may include multiple data points. Examples of evidence that might be included, but are not limited to, out-of-state learning plans, cognitive assessments demonstrating advanced cognitive ability, advanced achievement scores, documentation of advanced performance in juried competitions, portfolios, or written recommendations. Additional details and examples of items that might be included and/or requested in a student's BOE can be found on the [Stargate admissions website](#). Examples are not exclusive and are only provided to assist applicants in deciding what they may want to submit as a part of a BOE. Qualified Stargate staff may provide supplementary measures to gather further information to support the BOE, if needed.

Assistance for establishing the BOE is available for applicants. More information can be located on our [Stargate admission website](#).

In accordance with CCR 301-88-2.02(E)(3), Stargate will provide assistance for students who are Multilingual Learners (MLL) to assure that a student's level of English proficiency is not a determining factor in the admissions process by offering interpretation services for students' whose heritage language is something other than English. To request interpretation services, visit the [Stargate admissions website](#).

3. Body of Evidence Support

Applicants who do not have an existing Advanced Learning Plan (ALP), or other components of a BOE may receive support from qualified Stargate staff to develop a comprehensive BOE in alignment with 1 CCR 301-88-2.02(E). Stargate is dedicated to supporting the collection of this BOE and will not place undue burden on families. Stargate reserves the right to reevaluate any applicant whose evaluations were performed by a private agency, e.g., a non-public school. Permission to evaluate is automatically granted to Stargate by submitting the application form.

Stargate School is committed to ensuring equitable access to gifted education for all students. In accordance with the Colorado Anti-Discrimination Act (CADA), federal Title VI requirements, and the Charter Schools Act [C.R.S. 22-30.5-104(3)], Stargate takes intentional and proactive measures to identify and support students from historically marginalized groups, including low-income students, students with disabilities, Multilingual Learners, and students of color. To advance this commitment, Stargate implements research-based methodologies designed to recognize advanced potential in students who have been traditionally underrepresented in gifted and twice-exceptional education at the district, state, and national levels. These efforts help ensure that all students, regardless of background, have equitable opportunities to access and benefit from gifted programming.

Pursuant to Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) Students who are currently receiving accommodations through Section 504 or through an IEP are legally entitled to their plan's accommodations during testing and throughout the admissions process.

4. Body of Evidence Review

Stargate's admissions committee is composed of qualified staff to review a student's BOE in alignment with the Exceptional Children's Educational Act (ECEA); this process outlines the requirements for evaluating whether a student's educational needs align with the instructional model of schools designed for exceptional students.

To ensure objectivity and reduce bias during the review process, Stargate conducts an anonymized evaluation of each applicant's BOE. All personally identifiable information, including name, race, ethnicity, gender, disability status, English language proficiency, and socioeconomic background, is removed or already unknown prior to review.

The admissions committee uses a standardized scoring tool to assess the BOE consistently and equitably. In accordance with Colorado regulations, some types of data are considered more impactful based on their reliability. For example, cognitive or advanced achievement data may be considered more significant than narrative recommendations when determining educational need and program alignment. This process ensures that all applicants are reviewed fairly and in compliance with state law, while supporting Stargate's mission to provide an educational environment appropriate for exceptional learners. To ensure consistency, and alignment with best practices, the standardized scoring tool used in the review process is evaluated annually.

5. Lottery Process

The lottery process adheres with the requirements set forth in CRS 22-30.5-104. All applicants that demonstrate the need for placement at Stargate will be entered into a random computerized lottery administered under the supervision of an independent lawyer, seats are offered based on the following priorities and available spaces:

- a) **Sibling Status:** A sibling of an enrolled student, that demonstrates the need for placement at Stargate, regardless of residence status, receives first preference for admission. "Enrolled student" includes any student who is currently attending Stargate or has accepted a seat offer following the lottery.
- b) **Stargate Employee:** Children of current employees that demonstrate a need for placement at Stargate, regardless of residence status, will receive next preference for admissions.
- c) **Independent Board Member:** Children of current or former Independent Stargate Board members who successfully completed at least one full year, and were in good standing, as defined by Board policy, and that demonstrate a need for placement at Stargate, will receive the next preference for admission.
- d) **In-District:** An applicant who resides in Adams 12 Five Star School District that demonstrates a need for placement at Stargate, will receive next priority. One proof of residency, as approved per Adams District Five Star School District (water, utility, xcel, mortgage bill, etc.), must be uploaded to the application system. An otherwise out-of-district student who is currently attending an Adams 12 school for at least one entire school year will be classified for admissions purposes as an in-district student.
- e) **Out-of-District:** Applicants that demonstrate a need for placement at Stargate, who reside in a district other than Adams 12 Five Star School District, will have last priority.

Applicant Lottery Pool: Stargate utilizes a waitpool for each grade level instead of a numbered waitlist. When space becomes available, seats are filled through a computerized lottery process from the appropriate grade level waitpool. This approach ensures that all applicants have an equal opportunity to be selected if vacancies arise.

If an offer is not made to an applicant for the upcoming school year, the applicant will be removed from the waitpool. In order to enter the lottery pool for the next school year, the applicant must login to the electronic application system and complete a new application for the next school year. No additional information to complete the BOE will be requested as Stargate will keep the applicant's BOE on file.

6. Applicants Who Demonstrate A Need For Placement At Stargate

- a) **Communication:** Applicants whose BOE demonstrate the need for placement at Stargate will be sent an electronic notification via the application system prior to the lottery. It is important to remember that because the number of applicants exceeds the number of spaces available, a need for placement does not guarantee a seat offer.
- b) For applicants chosen for available spaces from the lottery, a notification of a seat offer will be sent in February via the application system. An acceptance response will be due within 5 calendar days of the seat offer notification.
- c) Should an open seat become available following the lottery, students will be selected by lottery from the appropriate grade level waitpool and notified by electronic notification via the application system. Parents/Guardians will have 5 calendar days to accept the seat offer during the admissions window. If a seat becomes available after the final day of the current school year, families will have three (3) calendar days to accept the seat offer.
- d) Applicants not chosen through the lottery process will be notified that they are being placed into a grade level waitpool. If a seat offer is not made, the applicant will be removed from the waitpool. In order to enter the lottery for the next school year, the applicant must login to the electronic application system and complete a new application for the next school year. No additional information to complete the BOE will be requested as Stargate will keep the applicant's BOE on file.

7. Applicants Who Do Not Demonstrate A Need For Placement At Stargate

- a) **Communication:** Applicants who submit a BOE but do not demonstrate a need for placement at Stargate will be notified electronically through the application system. This determination is based on a comprehensive review of the submitted BOE and alignment with Stargate's criteria for admission.

- b) If new or updated evidence becomes available that supports advanced potential, families are encouraged to submit a new application during a future admissions cycle. Stargate values each applicant's unique strengths and recognizes that a need for placement at Stargate can evolve over time.

- c) **Appeals:** Families who disagree with the determination may file an appeal. Appeal must be submitted to admissions@stargateschool.org by 11:59 pm MST on the 7th calendar day after notification. The appeal should clearly explain why the parent/guardian believes the student demonstrates a need for placement at Stargate. New or additional evidence that was not part of the original body of evidence may be submitted with the appeal to support the request for reconsideration. Appeals will be reviewed by qualified staff, who were not involved in the original admissions determination, and a written response will be provided within 5 business days.

8. Additional Information

- a) Once a student is enrolled in Stargate School, they do not need to reapply. They will automatically be enrolled into the next grade unless a withdrawal form is submitted. The number of seats available for the lottery will be determined by the number of students not returning the following school year.
- b) **Withdrawing:** If you know your student will not be returning the following school year, we ask that you complete and sign our withdrawal form, which is available by emailing registration@stargateschool.org.
- c) **Return Policy:** Students who leave Stargate School for one calendar year or less may notify the admissions office and request to be placed in the waitpool for the current academic year. Students will receive priority behind siblings of currently enrolled students and employee children. Students will remain in the waitpool for up to one calendar year from the student's official date of withdrawal. If the student is not offered a seat for the current academic year, students will need to reapply and will enter the lottery process along with new prospective students.

Appendices

Appendix A: Definition of "Need for Placement at Stargate"

Definition: *"Need for placement at Stargate"* refers to evidence-based indicators that a student's advanced learning needs and exceptional abilities would be appropriately served by Stargate's specialized instructional approach. This determination is based on a comprehensive review of a student's Body of Evidence (BOE) and evaluates whether the student's educational needs align with Stargate's educational model and charter that is designed for gifted and advanced learners.

Students who demonstrate a need for placement typically exhibit one or more of the following:

- Advanced cognitive ability (as evidenced by norm-referenced testing)
- Exceptional achievement significantly above grade level
- Creative or performance-based strengths indicative of gifted potential
- Identification as gifted under ECEA or comparable guidelines

This relies on multiple forms of evidence and is made through a comprehensive, equitable review process. No single piece of data is determinative, neither sufficient to guarantee placement nor disqualifying on its own. The review team conducts a holistic evaluation of the entire BOE, prioritizing reliable, standardized, and objective measures while considering all relevant information.

This policy is reviewed annually to ensure its integrity. Recommendations for changes are presented to the Governance Board, who must approve any modifications.

1.11 Executive Director Succession Planning

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Executive Director Succession Planning Policy is to establish the policy for identifying a recommended emergency replacement and also identifying current staff with administrator potential.

SCOPE

This policy applies to the Governance Board, the Executive Director of Academics, and the Executive Director of Operations and Finance.

RESPONSIBILITY AND AUTHORITY

- The Executive Director of Academics is responsible for documenting the succession plan for the Executive Director of Academics in accordance with this policy.
- The Executive Director of Operations and Finance is responsible for documenting the succession plan for the Executive Director of Operations and Finance in accordance with this policy.
- The Governance Board is responsible for reviewing the succession plan annually.

SUCCESSION PLANNING

Objective

The objective of succession planning is to provide documented recommendations from both the Executive Director of Academics and the Executive Director of Operations and Finance regarding current staff members with potential for acting as, or replacing, the Executive Director of Academics and the Executive Director of Operations and Finance if needed.

Documentation

The Executive Director of Academics will document their recommendations to Board, including:

- **Watch List** - A list of current staff that may be potential succession candidates as the administrator.
- **Emergency Replacement** - Qualified staff member that can effectively cover a vacancy for up to six (6) months and a plan for temporary coverage of unplanned circumstances.

For each candidate identified, a rationale will be provided, including:

- Description of current and previous professional development efforts and leadership roles; and
- Assessment of leadership capabilities

The Executive Director of Operations and Finance will document their recommendations to the Board, including:

- **Watch List** - A list of current staff that may be potential succession candidates as the administrator; and



- **Emergency Replacement** - Qualified staff member who can effectively cover a vacancy for up to six (6) months and a plan for temporary coverage of unplanned circumstances.

For each candidate identified by the Executive Director of Operations and Finance, a rationale will be provided, including:

- a description of professional qualifications and experience to serve as the Executive Director of Operations and Finance; and
- an assessment of leadership capabilities.

Review

The documented succession recommendations will be reviewed by the Board annually, no later than June 30th of each school year.

HIRING PROCESS

Process for hiring an Executive Director of Academics

In the event that the **Executive Director of Academics** position needs to be filled, the following process will foster transparency and stakeholder involvement:

1. Prepare the job description/job posting for Board approval
2. Post for the position of Executive Director of Academics utilizing posting services to ensure state-wide and national reach
3. Form an ad hoc search committee consisting of
 - i. Two (2) Board members
 - ii. At least one (1) member of the School Accountability Committee
 - iii. Representatives of the Administration
 - iv. Representatives from the staff, and teachers, including representation of teachers from both the K-5 and the Secondary School
 1. The Board may also appoint any other individuals to the ad hoc committee that the Board determines would be helpful in the hiring process
4. Ad hoc committee review of all qualified applications to identify the top candidates
5. In person or video conference interviews of the top candidates conducted by the ad hoc committee, review of all submitted material including written responses to questions provided by Human Resources to the candidates
6. Recommendation of up to 3 top candidates to the Board
7. Participate by the top candidates in a Community Town Hall
8. Board interviews, in open meeting, of the top candidates
9. Board selection of the finalist for the Executive Director of Academics and community notification
10. Board vote on whether to extend an offer to the finalist for the Executive Director of Academics at least 14 days after community notification of the Board's selection of the finalist.



Process for hiring the Executive Director of Operations and Finance

In the event that the Executive Director of Operations and Finance position needs to be filled, the following process will foster transparency and stakeholder involvement:

1. Prepare the job description/job posting for Board approval
2. Post for the position of Executive Director of Operations and Finance utilizing posting services to ensure state-wide and national reach
3. Form an ad hoc search committee consisting of
 - a Two (2) Board members
 - b The chairperson of the Finance Committee and one other member of the Finance Committee
 - c Representatives of the Administration
 - d Representatives from the staff, and teachers, including representation of both K5 and the Secondary School
 - i The Board may also appoint any other individuals to the ad hoc committee that the Board determines would be helpful in the hiring process
4. Ad hoc committee review of all qualified applications to identify the top candidates
5. In person or video conference interviews of the top candidates conducted by the ad hoc committee, review of all submitted material including written responses to questions provided by Human Resources to the candidates
6. Recommendation of up to 3 top candidates to the Board
7. Participation by the top candidates in a Community Town Hall
8. Board interviews, in open meeting, of the top candidates
9. Board selection of the finalist for the Executive Director of Operations and Finance
10. Board vote on whether to extend an offer to the finalist for the Executive Director of Operations and Finance at least 14 days after notifying the community of the Board's selection of the finalist.

Documentation

The process described in Section 5.1 can be amended as deemed necessary by the Board. However, the plan must be defined and documented and communicated to the stakeholders prior to initiating the applicable change.

1.0 INTENT AND PURPOSE

The intent of this document is to describe policies and procedures that ensure compliance with Stargate Bylaws and transparency concerning positions that are the responsibility of the Governance Board to appoint (Stargate Bylaws 5.2.2 and 5.3). If there is overlap between this and the Stargate Bylaws and/or Charter, those documents take precedence.

2.0 BOARD COMPOSITION

The Governance Board shall consist of five Parent Directors and up to four Independent Directors, as long as the majority membership of the Board is held by Parent Directors (Stargate Bylaws 5.2).

2.1 Appointing Open Positions

When a Parent Director vacancy occurs, the Governance Board shall select a parent, by majority vote, to fill the vacancy within thirty days. This position will be filled on an interim basis until June 30 immediately following the next election (Stargate Bylaws 5.3).

If the Governance Board determines the need to fill an Independent Director position, the Board shall appoint an eligible person by majority vote. This person will serve a three-year term beginning the month following appointment and ending June 30 of their third year (Stargate Bylaws 5.2.2). The position is not subject to term limits (Stargate Bylaws 5.2.5).

2.2 Eligible Candidates

Parents are eligible to become a candidate for the Governance Board when their child has attended the school for 20 calendar days (Stargate Bylaws 4.1).

An Independent Director is neither a parent nor a staff member, and has not been either within one year of appointment (Stargate Bylaws 5.2.2). As defined by the Stargate Bylaws 4.1, a staff member is a full-time employee of the faculty or administration.

3.0 CANDIDATE NOMINATION PROCESS

A Parent or Independent Director candidate may agree to be nominated, or self-nominate, by submitting an application form to the Governance Board or Recruiting Committee, who will then determine the candidate's eligibility (Stargate Bylaws 5.2.7). The application form can be developed by the Governance Board and/or Recruiting Committee. The Recruiting Committee may assist in advertising opportunities, collecting and processing applications, managing communication with the community and other correspondence, delivering information to the Board, and developing recruiting methods and referral processes. They may also work with the Governance Board to develop a job description and any other necessary materials. The Board will work with

the Recruiting Committee prior to each nomination period to define specific roles and processes. These are usually detailed in the Recruiting Committee Charter.

The Governance Board may invite approved candidates to introduce themselves during public comment at the next business meeting. Interviews for Parent Directors and Independent Directors will be conducted during the business meeting. Given the short time allowance for appointments of parents to Parent Director vacancies, an introduction and interview will typically occur at the same business meeting. For Independent Director positions, the Board may choose to have an introduction and interview at two different business meetings.

Independent Directors who desire to serve an additional term will participate in the nomination process outlined above.

Candidates are appointed by a majority vote of the Board.

4.0 NOMINATION PERIODS

The nomination period for a Parent Director vacancy begins as soon as possible after the resignation of a Parent Director and continues until a determined time prior to the business meeting during which a new Parent Director will be appointed. This time period will be determined by the Board and Recruiting Committee in order to meet the 30-day requirement.

The Governance Board can define a nomination period for Independent Directors when a need to fill a position has been identified. For ongoing consistency, they may choose to have a nomination period in the spring, with interviews during business meetings in the months ahead of the new board term beginning July 1.

5.0 STAGGERED TERMS FOR INDEPENDENT DIRECTORS

To promote consistency of Board membership and transitions among members, the Governance Board may plan for staggered appointments of Independent Directors to balance and/or align with staggered terms of Parent Directors.
