## III. School Update

### A. Executive Director Updates

MR, shared updates on the following

- Throughout our **17 day period**, **10.92% of lower school staff were marked tardy**, based on a total staff count of 56 (104 total late occurrences).
- **Down from 14.97% in March. 3.68%** of lower school staff were **marked absent** (35 total absences). **Down from 4.51% in March.** 4/14 recorded the highest number of tardies with 15 teachers arriving late. 4/24 recorded the highest number of absences with 5 staff members out.
- Throughout our **17 day period**, **10.08% of high school staff were marked tardy**, based on a total staff count of 28 (48 total late occurrences). **Down from 13.79% in March.**
- **4.83%** of high school staff were **marked absent** (23 total absences). **Down from 6.73% in March.** 4/14 recorded the highest number of tardies with 7 teachers arriving late. 4/27 and 4/28 recorded the highest number of absences with 4 staff members out each day.
- Student attendance **Increased** from **91.09% in March** to **92.7% in April.** Attendance had the highest rate at **95.13% on April 2nd** and the lowest at **87.09% on April 28th**
- Student attendance **Increased** from **81.42% in March** to **82.3% in April.** Attendance had the highest rate at **88.30% on April 23rd** and the lowest at **59.12% on April 2nd.**
